


Thanks are extended to Fenety Marketing Services for assisting the Command in the collections of donations and for the production and distribution of the book. It is a huge undertaking!

BAKER, Cecil Claude





BARTRAM, Howard



BRITTS, Alfred Joseph

WWII

Alfred was born on November 4, 1915 in Humboldt, SK. He had 8 siblings, 2 of whom also served in the War. He married Burnace Parker of Winnipeg shortly before he was ordered to England. On July 21, 1944, Alfred and 6 other young men were killed in action over Haarl, near Tubbergen, Overijssel, Holland, when at 8,000 feet a German fighter aircraft collided with a Lancaster aircraft #PB 174. The information about the #405 City of Vancouver Squadron, Pathfinder Force is recorded in 2 brief notes included in a memorial book that is on display in the BC Aviation Museum.

BROCK, John William Angus

WWII

John was born on November 17, 1924 in McTaggart, SK. He served with the Royal Canadian Air Force and his squadron was 437 Husky Squadron, 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton, ON. He was in this squadron when it was formed in September 1944 to its disbandment in June of 1946. He received the following medals for his service: Bomber Command Commemorative Medal, France and Germany Star, Defense Medal, CVSM with Bar, and the 1939-45 War Medal. He joined The Royal Canadian Legion Abernethy Branch #26 and was an officer. John passed away on April 6, 2002.





BROWN, Arthur

Arthur joined the Canadian Armed Forces on May 11, 1942. He had 8 weeks of basic training in Shilo, MB and took 6 weeks of training in rifle, Bren gun, Sten gun, TMC, P.I.A.T. grenade, 2# Mortar, T.S.M.C. and M3. He was posted overseas as a sniper with 3 Bn of 2nd Canadian Light Infantry Reg. And served in England, France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. He received France & Germany Star, Defense Medal, War medal and Canadian Volunteer Service medal with Clasp. Arthur was discharged on May 1, 1945.

BROWN, Joe



CARIGNAN, Gaston A.






CURTIS, Ken R.







His Lancaster Bomber was shot down over Etaples France with all the crew except one being killed in the crash with the lone survivor taken prisoner. DYKUN, J.




FOSTER, Donald R.





GENT, Robert Frederick



MARTIN, Cyril E.

WWI & WWII

Cyril was born in England on Feb. 18,1900. With the outbreak of WWI, Cyril enlisted with the Canadian Army. Soon he was sent to England where he received further military training. He was then sent to France. He was posted to the 7th Canadian Railway Troop Regiment. Cyril fought at the Battle of YPRES and PASSCHENDELE in Belgium. When WWII broke out, Cyril again enlisted in the Army. In 1942 he was sent to England for intensive military training. He was transferred to the 17th Field Regiment, RCA in 1943. He was honoured by receiving "The Medal of the Legion of Honours." Cyril passed away on Nov. 17, 2003 at the age of 103.

MARTIN, Lloyd William

WWII

Lloyd was born on March 20, 1926 in Kindersley, SK. He joined the Army and served in Canada with the Canadian Technical Training Corps from June 11, 1943 to Feb.18, 1944. He transferred to the Air Force where he served in Saskatoon, Regina, Edmonton, and Whitehorse. He was discharged on March 15, 1946. In Dec. of 1950, he rejoined the R.C.A.F. and served in Tacoma Washington and was stationed at Dorval, QC with the 426 Transport Squadron as an Aircraft electrician on the Korean Airlift. 

Lance Corporal McClennan of Prince Albert served in the Army with the Queen's Own Highlanders during World War II. He was killed in action in France on August 8, 1944, at age 20. He is buried at Beny-Sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery near Reviers, France. Jim was the son of William R. and Eva A. G. McClennan, who went to the Coxby District north of Birch Hills in 1910. Ivan was born on June 18, 1922 in the Plumbridge district of SK (later named Lacadena). He worked for the local farmers in the district until he enlisted with the Armed Forces. He was attached to the South Saskatchewan Regiment and was posted overseas. At the age of 22 he was wounded on September 17, 1944 at Bray Dunes Plage. Ivan passed away 4 days later and is buried at Adegem Canadian War Cemetery, Maldegem Oost-Vlaanderen, Belgium.

MCDONALD, Jim

Jim was born to Hugh and Cassie (Mowatt) McDonald on May 23, 1922 - the youngest of seven children. He attended Dalesboro School. In 1940, Jim enlisted in the Canadian Army and served with the Regina Rifles where he trained to be a rifleman. He was discharged in 1945. Upon returning to Saskatchewan, Jim married and found employment at IPSCO. He and his wife, Elsie, raised four children. Jim passed away with cancer in August 1982.



Bill was born on the family homestead in 1914 on the banks of Moose Creek, SK. He was the second son of John and Davina McDonald. He joined the Canadian Army in 1945 and was sent to Peterborough, Ontario for training as a member of the #10 Platoon. He was later discharged and then in 1953 he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He spent three years in the Air Force and when discharged he went back to farming. The farming was grain and Black Angus cattle but after developing heart trouble he sold the cattle and replaced them with sheep. Bill married Esther Efford in 1964. They moved into Carnduff where Bill enjoyed doing volunteer work.

Evan joined the Armoured Corps of the Canadian Army on July 5, 1944. He was discharged on December 18, 1945. He then attended University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon from 1946 to 1949. Evan re-enlisted in the Canadian Army and spent time in Korea. He retired from the Services on August 19, 1971 as a Major.



William was born in 1919 in Gull Lake, SK. He enlisted with the RCAF and served with the #419 Moose Squadron in England and Europe. On the 5th mission, a German Folker Wolf 190 spotted them and began firing, and their airplane was hit and caught on fire. The crew continued to do their job as William downed 2 of the 3 Folker Wolf aircraft that were firing on them; the 3rd turned away and left. Their plane crash-landed, all the crew survived, but they were eventually captured by the Germans and spent the next two years as POWs. William escaped just before the end of the war.

McMORRIS, Allan

WWII

Allan was born in 1919 in Abernethy, SK. He served on Active Service with the R.C.A.F. as an Aircraft Mechanic from August 11, 1941 until October 20, 1945. He served with the 143 Wing, 440 Squadron and arrived overseas on January 17, 1944 to Ayr, Scotland. He served in Canada, England, France, Germany and Belgium. He received the following Medals: CVSM and Clasp, 1939-45 Star, France and Germany Star, Defense Medal and War Medal. He was a member of The RCL for 49 years. Allan passed away in 1994.





McMORRIS (PAGE), Marjorie Law

Marjorie was born in 1922 in Abernethy, SK. She served on Active Service with the Royal Canadian Air Force Women's Division from March 25, 1942 until December 18, 1945. Ernest was born on May 14, 1884 in Ernesttown Township, ON. He came to Saskatchewan in 1909 to homestead. He enlisted with the army during WWI and served with the 60th Battalion in France. After the war he farmed for a few years, then operated a hardware store in Wiseton. He was Vice-Grand of the local Off Fellows Lodge and a member of the Masonic Lodge. Ernest passed away on January 9, 1933 and is buried in Cataraqui Cemetery in Kingston, ON.

REGIMBAL, Alfred Emile

Alfred was born on June 15, 1918 in Lafleche, SK. He enlisted with the RCAF in 1940 and trained as a pilot at Trenton, ON. After his training he was stationed in Calgary, Alberta as an instructor. While flying on a training mission over Cochrane, AB with an American student Pilot, Leading Aircraftsman Quentin Burl Chase of Wichita, Kansas their plane struck an unmarked cable across the Bow River and crashed, killing both airmen. Alfred is buried in Lafleche. A cairn was erected in their memory on the old Banff HWY, 28 miles west of Calgary, adjacent to the site of the accident.





REGIMBAL, Wilfred Henry

Wilfred was born on August 27, 1916 in Lafleche, SK. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in June of 1941 and instructed at No. 15 EFTS in Regina before going overseas. Wilfred and a crew comprised of four Canadians and on British airman were reported missing after an aerial combat on November 22, 1944. On March 10, 1945 official word was received by his family that the aircraft had crashed in the Monschau Forest near Rocherath, Belgium. The crew was buried at Rheinberg, Germany. Regimbal Bay is named in his honour.
