



ANDERSON, Arthur Benjamin


WWI

WWI




ANDERSON, Melvin






ANDERSON, Murray






ARCHER, John






AUCKLAND, Donald Edgar

AUCKLAND, Reginald Gordon "Reg" WWII





BARRY, Edward Henry "Eddie"


WWII

BEADLE, Walter Garnett





WWI





WWI






BERGREN, Ray Edward



BLACKWELL (nee ROBERTS), Kathleen WWII



BLOSS, Frederick William "Fred"





WWI





CHAMBERS, Richard Eric



WWII






COWLEY, Paul

At the onset of WWII, he enlisted again and spent the war years as a prisoner of war guard in Alberta. Paul died on November 14, 1972.

COX, Henry Charles "Charlie"


WWI

Charlie was born in 1897 in Leicester, England. He came to Saskatchewan in the 1920s and worked on farms in various locations until he settled in the Glynfield district, north of Plunkett. He married Elizabeth Smith of England – quite literally off the boat, and together, they raised three children. Because of Charlie's service in the Army during WWI, he applied for and was accepted as the postmaster of Plunkett. Charlie died in 1932 and Elizabeth carried on until her retirement in 1962.

COX, Sidney

WWI

Sidney was born to John Edward and Ellen Cox of Balscote, Banbury, Oxon in England on October 11, 1886. He farmed in the Viscount, SK area before enlisting in the Army on December 11, 1915 in Saskatoon, SK and serving overseas as a Private with the 46th Battalion, Saskatchewan Regiment. His wife was Fanny Mary Cox of Mindemoya, Manitoulin Island, ON. Sidney was killed in action on May 5, 1917 and he is buried at La Chaudière Military Cemetery in Vimy, located at Pas de Calais, France.



CRANCH (nee NUGENT), Mary Helen

WWII

Mary was one of five siblings that enlisted in WWII. She and her brothers, Ed and Don, joined the Army while George enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and Ella served with the Navy. Mary married Robert Cranch of Colonsay, Saskatchewan whose work was with the National Secretary Treasurer Brac Union, Montreal, Quebec. They have three children.



World War II Veterans Remembered At High School Provincial Football Playoff



The Bud Weaver Memorial Trophy is awarded annually to the Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association's 4A Provincial Football Champion. The provincial football championship game is held every year on the second weekend in November. The championship trophy is named the Bud Weaver trophy which honors the late Bud Weaver. The 2012 championship game marked the 64° anniversary of the tribute. Bud died while serving with the RAF during World War II.

Harold (Bud), Weaver attended Bedford Road Collegiate and the University of Saskatchewan where he played as a halfback and punter with the Huskies. He also played professionally for some time following his days with the Huskies. In May 1941 at age 28, he was posted overseas. He was killed in action on September 20, 1941.

Until 1946, a provincial high school final had never been held, but in the course of a few days that November, the idea took wing. Four days before the game, Ross Pinder, a former Huskie quarterback, got together with the University of Saskatchewan coaches. They each contributed \$15 toward buying a trophy to be awarded to the provincial high school football champion. In honor of Bud Weaver and other Huskies the inscription reads: In revered memory of the members of the University of Saskatchewan Huskies who lost their lives in the Great War 1939-45.

CRAWFORD, Everett John Wesley



WWII


Garnet went to school in Viscount, Saskatchewan and farmed south of there, later moving to the Birch Hills region to farm. Garnet served in World War II.

Arthur was born on March 5, 1877 in Claremont, Minnesota. In 1903, he married Lionne Parker and they emigrated from Nebraska to Vermilion, AB with their five children in 1913. After joining the Army in North Battleford, SK on September 2, 1916, he moved the family to Prince Albert, SK. Arthur was a Private with the 46th Canadian Battalion and served in Holland, Germany and France where he injured his back in Vimy. After his discharge in 1918, he farmed and broke green horses on land north of Prince Albert, SK. He and his wife raised nine children. His two sons, Robert and Perry, enlisted in WWII. Arthur was a member of Christopher Lake Legion Branch 159 and he died on July 3, 1942.



CROWE, Frederick Perry "Perry"

WWII

Perry was born on February 2, 1914 in Cottonwood, South Dakota, USA but went to various country schools in Northern Saskatchewan and in Prince Albert, SK. He loved to hunt, was a skilled fisherman and he farmed and logged in various places in Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Perry married Marjorie Whitter and had two children. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy in April 1944 and served overseas on HMCS Atlantic and Cornwallis, serving as a Gunnery Mate. He was discharged on December 14, 1945. His brother, Bob, also enlisted in WWII and his dad, Arthur, had enlisted in WWI. Perry spent his last days in Fort St. John, BC where he died on March 17, 1988.


DOLPHIN (nee DANIELSON), Martha Edna WWII














ECKSTEIN, John




FLEMING, John Thomas "Tom" WWI & WWII

WWI



GOODRICH, Henry Charles "Harry"


WWII














HALLDORSON, Lloyd

WWII






KISS, Joseph Steven "Joe"

LACEY, Charles



LATOURNEAU, Earl



John was born in Carmel, SK on December 15, 1915 to Roman and Maggie Leniuk, pioneers from Ukraine who came to homestead in the Brithdir district of Saskatchewan. John was working in a northern Saskatchewan sawmill when he enlisted. His siblings, Peter, Donald and Marie, also enlisted in the Army, while his sister, Pearl, was with the Royal Canadian Air Force. John served overseas as a Private with the Saskatoon Light Infantry (M.G.), 1st Infantry Division, Support Battalion of the Royal Canadian Infantry Corps. A geo-memorial was named in his honour: Leniuk Lake, east of Charlebois Lake, Sask. (74P7) 59°28′104°39′. John was killed in action on July 24, 1943 and is buried in the Agira Canadian War Cemetery, in Enna, Sicily, Italy.

LEONEW, Joseph "Joe"

WWII

Joe was born in Plunkett, SK in 1917 and attended Badger school, just north of there. He volunteered for service in the Army in 1941 and served during World War II. After his discharge in 1945, he farmed in the Guernsey district until 1967 when a house was bought in Humboldt, SK. Joe then worked as a park superintendent and caretaker of Humboldt Town Hall until his death in December 1983. Joe and his wife, Helen Huculak, raised five children.





LeROY, Albert Patrick

WWII

Albert was born in Viscount, Saskatchewan. He joined the Army and served as a Trooper in Italy with the British Columbia Dragoons of the 9th Armoured Regiment. He was killed in action in Italy on September 5, 1944. Albert is commemorated on the Cassino War Memorial, Frosinone Province, in Italy, for soldiers from the Italian Campaign with no known grave. A geo-memorial has been named in his honour: Leroy Lake, west of Snare Lake, Saskatchewan, at (74J5) 58° 24' 107° 52'.



LeROY, Ronald "Ron"





Herb was a member of Viscount Legion Branch 271 and he died on April 12, 1990.

Enid was born in Plunkett, SK and went to school there. Her brothers, Reg and Jim, enlisted in the Army and Enid joined the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service. After her discharge, she obtained her teaching certificate and taught at Meeting Lake where she married Len Liddell. They raised three children. Enid is in Edmonton, Alberta.

MAGUIRE, James Frankish

James was born to James and Bertha Maguire on May 6, 1915 in Colonsay, SK. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on June 29, 1940 in Edmonton, AB and served as a Flight Lieutenant with the 37th Squadron in Canada and in the Mediterranean. He and six other crew members were reported missing and were presumed to have died on September 14, 1942 when his Wellington was lost near Lagos, Nigeria (West Africa). Having no known grave, James' name is inscribed on the Malta Memorial in Valetta. He left a wife, Bernice Luella, in Edmonton, SK. James was awarded the Air Observer's Badge on February 2, 1941 as well as the 1939-45 Star, the African Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp and the War Medal 1939-45.







WWII



WWII



He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in July 1940, obtained his pilot wings and served as a Flight Lieutenant in Canada, Newfoundland and on the North Atlantic coast. He was also a flying instructor for two years at the Service Flying School then flew Cansos (Catalina Flying Boats) over the North Atlantic from Torbay, NL. Discharged in August 1945, he was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, the 1939-45 Star, the Atlantic Star, and the War Medal 1939-45. 




MARKLEY, David

McINTYRE, John Brodie "Jack"


WWI

WWII



His family, originally named Melnyk, came from Poland in 1911 to a farm north of Plunkett. Nick and his two brothers, Steve and Joe, all enlisted, Nick joining the Royal Canadian Air Force and serving overseas as a Flying Officer (Air Bomber) with the # 49 Squadron RAF. He was killed on April 11, 1944 when his Lancaster went missing during a night raid on Aachen, Germany. Nick is buried at Schoonselhof Cemetery, in Antwerp, Belgium. There is a geomemorial in Saskatchewan named in his honour: Melnick Lake, northeast of Wollaston Lake, at (64L9) 58° 44' 102° 12'.






MELNICK, Steve

Duncan was born in Plunkett, SK and attended the nearby Glynfield country school. His uncle, Willie Menzies, served in WWI while Duncan joined the Army and served in World War II. He raised two children with his wife, Elsie Richter, and they lived in Calgary, Alberta.

MENZIES, William "Willie"

Willie was born on November 10, 1886 in Perthshire, Scotland and came to Canada in 1913 with his brother, Thomas. Before the war, he was a carpenter and had served two years each with the Perth Royal Highlanders and the Highland Cycles Battalion. He enlisted on September 23, 1914 and served with the 10th Battalion in Canada, England and France where he was wounded in the leg in 1918, then hospitalized in England until the war ended. He then returned to carpentry in Humboldt, SK and in 1940, moved to Prince Rupert, BC to work for the American Army Services, receiving a Civilian Service Emblem for faithful, satisfactory service. Willie then lived on his brother, Tommy's farm, did local carpentry and enjoyed curling at the Glynfield Rink. He lived in Plunkett with Tom and his wife, Susan, until he died in 1980. He was a member of Humboldt Legion Branch 28.



MESZAROS, Steve

WWII

Steve was born in Plunkett, SK on August 4, 1916. He was the son of Steve and Julia Meszaros who came from Hungary in 1905 to homestead in the Plunkett area. Steve Jr. was educated at the Eltham and Plunkett schools and he taught at Wakaw, SK for a year before enlisting in the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals in 1938. He trained in Kingston, ON and served as a Lieutenant with the South Saskatchewan Regiment, Royal Canadian Infantry Corps in France and England. Steve was killed on August 28, 1944 at Caen, near Forêt de la Londe in France and is buried at Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France. While in London in 1941, he married Victoria and they had a daughter.





MILLER, Joseph "Joe"


WWII

MOEN, Carl Johan


WWII





MOORE, Lloyd







MORELLI, Jordan Edwin


PEACETIME





WWII





WWII



OSTERHOUT, Charles Morton "Charlie" WWII



WWI





WWI

Harmon was born in 1897 in Cadoxton, South Wales. His mother and three other siblings came from Wales to join up with his father and older brother, Thomas, in 1910. He hired out to work for various farmers before enlisting in the Army in 1918 during World War I, but Armistice was signed before he was sent overseas. He was discharged that same year. His brother, Thomas (T.J.), also enlisted but was killed in action in France. His other brother, Edwin, enlisted in WWII. After the war, Harmon obtained his teachers certificate in Saskatoon, SK and he taught for a year before returning to farming, retiring in 1967. He then lived with his sister, Olive, in Rosetown, SK.

His youngest brother, Edwin, enlisted in the Royal Canadian Navy during WWII. TJ is buried at the Triangle Cemetery at Inchy-en-Artois in Pas de Calais, France.

POTTER, William McLellan


WWI





WWII




ROBERTS (nee PEIRSON), Elizabeth "Betty" WWII

WWII



His brothers, Reg, Bert and Jim, also enlisted as well as their first cousins, Ron and Thomas. Ernest was killed in action at Verrières Ridge on July 21, 1944 and is buried at Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France. A geo-memorial is named in his honour: Roper Bay, in Daly Lake, Saskatchewan, at (74A5) 56 ° 28' 105 ° 41'. Ernest's father, Frank, is a veteran of the Boer War and WWI.

ROPER, Frank Gilbert

BOER WAR & WWI

Frank was born in Salisbury, England in 1885. He was a soldier of the 5th Dragoon Guards and served in both World War I and the Boer War. Frank married Mary 'Molly' (Kelly) and they had five children before immigrating to Plunkett, Saskatchewan in March 1926. He farmed in the Plunkett area until 1942, when they moved to Saskatoon, SK. Frank passed away in 1963. His four sons, Jim, Reg. Bert and Ernest, all enlisted and served in World War II.

Jim was born in Coventry England in 1913 and came to Plunkett, Saskatchewan with his family in 1926. He helped his dad farm until he enlisted in the Army to serve in World War II. 




WWI







SCHAFER, E. J.

SHOEMAKER, Otto F.

WWII

Otto was born on October 26, 1907 in White Russia and came with his parents to Saskatchewan's Young district in the early 1900s. In 1926, he came to the Plunkett area, worked for district farmers and then the Department of Highways until he retired in 1972. In February 1942, he joined the Army Service Corps, served in Canada and was discharged in 1944. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He raised six children with his wife, Evelyn Beadle, and was Overseer and village councilor of Plunkett, as well as a representative to the Boards of Lanigan Hospital and the Nursing Home. Otto was the only one of the family to have his surname 'Anglicized'. His half-brothers Jake, Rinhold, Art, Carl and Egon, who all enlisted, spelled it 'Schumaker'. Otto was a member of Viscount Legion Branch 271 and he died on January 27, 1990.

SICHKARYK, Paul

WWII

Paul was born in May 1916 and grew up on the family farm north of Plunkett, Saskatchewan. He took his early schooling at Badger and moved with the family to Carvel, Alberta in 1926. He enlisted in the Army in October 1942 and served overseas, where he was wounded twice. He was discharged in November 1945. After his discharge, Paul married Tillie Malowski, the young lady he'd corresponded with during the War. They had ten children, which included two sets of twins. Paul worked as a heavy duty mechanic until he retired.





SIEKAWITCH (SPENCER), Leo

Leo was born in Viscount, Saskatchewan in 1915. He went to school there and changed his surname from Siekawitch to Spencer before joining the Army where he served as a Corporal during World War II. After the war, he came back to work for a while with his dad, Tony, the GM dealer in Viscount. He then attained a Mechanical Engineering degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1950. 

SIGOUIN, James Joseph "Jim"


WWII





WWII





STENSRUD, Roy Vernon


WWII

His three siblings, Lillie, Wally and Merle, enlisted to serve in World War II, as well as his brother-in-law, Harvey Potts. He was single when he joined the Army in Humboldt, SK on March 10, 1916 and served as a Private with the 46th Overseas Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force, Canadian Infantry, Saskatchewan Regiment. Sydney was killed in action on August 20, 1917 and he is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial located at Pas de Calais, France. He gave his homestead to his father upon his death.



STOGRAN (nee MORELLI), Helen Virginia WWII




Alex served in the Army during World War I. He is listed in the March 2, 1917 edition of *The Viscount Sun* as one of the men from the Viscount District to have enlisted.



WWII




TITMAN, Frederick George "Fred" BOER WAR & WWI

WWI



VERES, Stephen John "Steve"

Steve was born on December 23, 1923 in Plunkett, SK and was the only living child of Alex and Rose Veres, homesteaders in the Plunkett area in 1908. Growing up, he worked on the farm and attended the Plunkett and Badger schools. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on November 8, 1942 and served as a Flight Sergeant with No. 356 Squadron RAF as a Wireless Operator/Air Gunner instead of as a pilot, due to his eyesight. Steve's Liberator was bombing Japanese troop concentrations at Alugale when it burst into flames and crashed west of Laung Chaung, Maya Peninsula, Myanmar (Burma). He died on June 12, 1945 and was buried at Taukkyan War Cemetery, Rangoon, Burma. A geomemorial in Saskatchewan was named in his honour: Veres Lake, southeast of Lloyd Lake, at (74F2) 57° 04' 108° 35'.





VOTH, Elmer Jacob "Shorty"

WWII

Shorty was born in Rosthern, SK on December 18, 1919. He came to Viscount, SK about 1937 and worked on Isaacson's threshing crew. He then returned to Langham, Saskatchewan, where he enlisted in the Army in 1940. After his discharge in 1944, he returned to Langham and then went back to Viscount where he worked for farmers in the area until his death in September 1971.

WWII


Jim was born in 1919, the only son of Fredrick and Jessie Wiley from Plunkett, SK. He attended school in Viscount as his parents had moved there to operate the power plant. Jim earned his private pilot's license in 1937 and married Nadine at Arden, Ontario. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served as a fighter pilot with No. 1 Squadron, RAF. He died when his Typhoon was shot down over the Cherbourg peninsula during a cross-Channel sweep on November 25, 1943. Jim is buried in the old Cherbourg Communal Cemetery in Manche, France. There is a geo-memorial: Wiley Bay on the west shore of Reindeer Lake, at (64E10) 57 ° 36' 102 ° 41'. His sister, Reta, claimed that a mountain "southwest of Lake Hagen and Turnstone Glacier in the Northwest Territories" was also named in Wiley's honour. Mount Wiley is in Sirmilik National Park on Herschel Island, Nunavut (340D10).





WILLIAMSON, Joseph Allan "Allan" WWII

















WRISTEN, Roy C.
